Illogan Sparnon Silver Band will be playing at Carn Brea Parish Council Carol Concert at Treloweth Community Hall on Tuesday 7th December at 6.30pm. In addition to traditional carols and popular Christmas songs they will be playing Thomas Merritt's "Hark the Glad Sound".

Thomas Merritt was born in Broad Lane in 1863 and was organist at Chili Road and Illogan Highway Chapels. He composed many works and will be best remembered for his Cornish Carols which are sung all over the world, wherever the Cornish settled. In 1902 he was commissioned to write a Coronation March for Edward VII's coronation. The 1830's in West Cornwall were the equivalent of the Merseysound in the 1960's. He died in 1908 aged 46.

The Creation of Carn Brea Parish Council

Before 1935, what is now the Carn Brea Parish area was administered by Illogan Parish Council. Illogan being the 3rd largest geographical parish in all Cornwall spreading from Ninemaidens School (Pencoys) to Porthtowan Beach and Penventon Gate (Buller Hill, Redruth) to Deadmans Cove, North Cliffs (near Hells Mouth). The boundaries roughly coincided with the Illogan Church Parish pre 1880 boundaries.

H.M. Government's Local Government Act of 1934 re-organised local government in Cornwall, creating 40 or so Urban and Rural Districts. Camborne Town, Illogan Parish and Redruth Town Councils were amalgamated to create the Camborne-Redruth Urban District which began its life in 1935. Throughout Cornwall, most towns and parishes kept

their Councils but with fewer powers. Unfortunately, Camborne, Illogan and Redruth were "accidentally" left out of the bill. This resulted in Camborne-Redruth Urban having all the new district and the old Parish powers all to itself. The 3 areas were in effect left unparished.

Kerrier District Council took over from 1974 when the 40 or so rural and Urban Districts were amalgamated into just 6 Urban Districts covering all the Cornish mainland.

Kerrier was an amalgamation of Camborne-Redruth, Helston and Kerrier Rural Districts, and found itself inheriting a situation where Parish Councils existed throughout Kerrier except in the Camborne-Illogan-Redruth area.

H.M. Government found itself being

petitioned for new Parishes to be created to rectify this matter. In the early 1980's it agreed to re-parish the area. Subsequently 8 new parishes were created in the Camborne-Redruth-Illogan area and a 9th at Gweek which was taken out of the Wendron Parish area.

Illogan was considered too large in area and population, having more residents than Redruth and was divided into 3 new Parishes – Portreath Parish, Illogan Parish and Carn Brea Parish.

1985 also saw the District and County Ward Boundaries re-drawn for the District elections in the May, so it was decided that Carn Brea Parish Boundaries would coincide with Illogan South County and District Electoral Divisions.

Carn Brea Parish Council was created out of Illogan Parish 50 years after Illogan was abolished. The new elections were set for March 1985. There were 3 wards of 5 Councillors each to be elected. 7 people stood for the 15 seats and were all elected unopposed. The first Parish Council meeting was held on April 30th 1985 at Pool Ambulance Hall.

The rest is another story

ILLOGAN SPARNON SILVER BAND

Illogan Sparnon Silver Band was set up in 1976 by Clifford Bolitho who had recently left Carharrack and St Day Silver Band as musical director. With the help of a small group of like minded people, Clifford launched the band and gradually began to build up the numbers. The band even managed to secure a plot of ground at Sparnon Gate and the history of the band began.

Over the years, ISSB has been associated with many large events and competitions. In 1977 the band led the Wheal Jane miners parade through London. They returned to London in 1979 where they led the Falmouth Docks parade. They took part in a broadcast on BBC Radio Devon in 1984 and in both 1989 and 1994, took part in a parade and a number of concerts in a tour of France.

The band were regular competitors at many competitions in the 70's, 80's and early 90's and worked their way through the sections by winning at many competitions. Some of their successes were as winners of the 4th section at Paignton in 1978 and winners of the 3rd Section at Barnstaple in 1981 & 1984.

The early 90's saw the loss of a number of players to larger, more successful bands

and a slump in numbers. This led to a gap of almost 15 years before the band felt able to start competing again. This they did on April 17th 2010 at the Cornwall Brass Band Association contest held at Tremough Campus. The band had practiced hard over a number of weeks under the tutelage of Shaun Marsden, the bandmaster and a former pupil of Clifford's. The band competed in the ungraded section against some experienced bands but their rendition of London River, and all the hard work, brought them second place behind Gweek Band.

The last few years has seen a resurgence in numbers and following a great effort, money was raised to replace the uniforms. The old uniforms were the same gold jackets with black cuffs and collars that were issued in 1976. The new jackets are black with gold collar and cuffs, as seen in the photo above, continuing in the Cornish theme. The new uniforms came at a cost of over £5000.

Clifford Bolitho is still the musical director and conducts the band at most of their appearances. He has never taken payment for this, even though he has taught a large number of very successful,

international musicians. In 2008 he was awarded the Diploma of Honour from the Worshipful Company of Musicians in recognition of over 60 years of service to music. This is one of the highest awards in brass band circles. The Cornwall Brass Band Association also presented Clifford with a certificate and medal for over 60 years of service to brass banding.

We will always welcome new players, no matter what their playing standards. The band practices on Tuesdays and Fridays between 7-30pm and 9-00pm, with the junior/new players meeting on a Thursday between 7-00pm and 8-30pm.

Carn Brea Parish

The Parish of Carn Brea, which is also known as the electoral area of Illogan South, lies between the twin towns of Camborne and Redruth. The boundaries include several villages, hamlets and rural areas as well as the urban area of Pool and Illogan Highway. The southern boundary is the village of Four Lanes, to the east Carnkie and Carn Brea Village, to the north Pool and West Tolgus and to the west part of Tuckingmill and Brea. The Council owns approximately 21 acres of land. This is made up of a park at Wheal Fortune, heath at Carn Brea Hill, an open space in Pool and an historic well at Carn Brea Village. It also maintains an area of land at Four Lanes.

Carn Brea Parish consists of the following villages and hamlets:

Barncoose, Blowinghouse, Bosleake, Bowling Green, Broad Lane, Carnarthen, Carn Brea Village, Carnkie, Forest, Four Lanes, Higher and Lower Brea, Illogan Highway, Pencoys, Piece, Pool, Tolskithy, Tregajorran, Treskillard, Tuckingmill and West Tolgus.

Membership of the Council

The Council consists of sixteen Councillors, with five members representing each of the wards of Barncoose, Pool and Four Lanes and one member representing the East Hill Ward (Tuckingmill). Councillors are elected every four years, the latest election being May 2007.

Benches

Benches have been installed in Barncoose Avenue at the request of the League of Friends of Redruth and Camborne Hospital. The benches have been dedicated to May and Bill Long who were staunch supporters of the League of Friends and Chairman of the League of Friends and Chairman of Carn Brea Parish Council respectively.

Parish Newsletter/Website

During the past year the Council has striven to improve the dissemination of information to the electorate and the Parish Newsletter has become a permanent quarterly publication. The Parish Website was launched in March 2007 giving Parishioners the opportunity to view information about the Council electronically. The Parish Plan has been added to the web site.

War Memorial

Research continues into the fallen from the Parish and a tablet has been added to the foot of the war memorial with the names of those that have been found. The Tregajorran War Memorial has been taken from storage at Cowlin's Mill and installed on the wall outside the Parish office.

Landscaping

The area in Four Lanes Square has been cleared and graveled and planters have been installed.

REMEMBRANCE SERVICE

Carn Brea Parish Council's annual Remembrance Service was held at Treloweth Community Hall War Memorial on Sunday, 1st November at 11.00 a.m. The Chairman of the Parish Council, Cllr. Mr. M. Moyle gave a short welcoming speech. Officiating was Clive Rawson, County Chairman of the Royal British Legion, who read out the names of the fallen that had been inscribed on the new tablet at the foot of the memorial. The service was conducted by Fr. Peter Fellows and the hymns were accompanied by Redruth Town Band. Mr. Brian Plint and Mr. Eric Boon (Parade Marshalls) organised the laying of wreaths and the Reveille was played by Dennis Floyd of the Stythians Band. Wreaths were laid on behalf of RAF Portreath, Carn Brea Parish Council, Royal British Legion (County Chairman), Camborne Town Council, Illogan Parish Council, Gwennap Parish Council, Redruth Royal British Legion, Illogan Royal British Legion and the 1st Pool Guides, 1st Pool Brownies and 1st Pool Rainbows.

Planning Committee

Under the Chairmanship of Cllr. C.E.N. Bickford the Committee made 111 observations on planning applications in the Parish.

Regeneration Committee

The Council has been involved in the consultation process on such schemes as the Heartlands Project, the Barncoose Link Road and the South Crofty/Dudnace Lane Framework Plan.

Historical Prints/Photographs

The Community Hall now houses a collection of historical prints and photographs depicting areas around the Parish. Further prints have been added to the collection during the year.

Pool in Bloom

The Pool in Bloom scheme continues to receive a favourable response.



Carol Concert

The Council held its fourth Carol Concert on Monday, 1st December at 6.00 p.m. at Treloweth Community Hall. Due to the inclement weather the carols were sung in the hall and accompanied by the Illogan Youth Band. The evening was well attended and made an enjoyable start to the Christmas festivities.

Notice Board

The Council has installed a notice board in the village of Brea, as a joint project with Camborne Town Council. The notice board will enable the Council to disseminate information to the wider community.

Bus Shelters

A new bus shelter has been installed at Pencoys, Four Lanes, with the aid of Cornwall Council grants.

Government Legislation & Consultation Documents

The Council has seen a plethora of changes in Government Legislation again this year

The number of documents being received by the Parish Council has multiplied and will continue to increase with the cessation of the District Council. The white paper, Communities in Control: Real Power, Real People is about passing power into the hands of local communities and sets out a range of policies to achieve this, building on work still in progress from the 2006 white paper, Strong and Prosperous Communities. Consultation documents received have included the Boundary Commission proposals,

Cornwall County Council Consultation on Path Priorities in the new Public Paths Strategy, a review of the Regional Spatial Strategy, Cornwall Waste Development Framework and Cornwall and West Devon Mining Landscape World Heritage and the Heartlands project. A more comprehensive list can be found in the Council's Best Value Report. The forthcoming year will bring new and exciting challenges for the Parish Council with the inception of the new unitary authority and continuing consultations on potential changes under the Communities in Control white paper.

Council Owned Property

Wheal Fortune Park

Regrettably all of the granite benches and picnic sets have had to be removed from Wheal Fortune Park due to vandalism.

Treloweth Community Hall and Open Space

An extension has been added to Treloweth Hall for the archiving of documents and the storage of equipment. The hall has been decorated and new chairs and blinds purchased.

The benches and picnic sets that had been vandalised have now been repaired are now back in place to allow local residents the opportunity to enjoy the open space. The Council has purchased a ride on mower to allow the Council owned land to be cut on a more frequent basis.

Treloweth Community Hall is used most evenings for classes and activities including belly dancing, slimming and keep fit. The hall also contains a collection of old photographs and prints of the parish.

BEST VALUE

In 1999 the Local Government Act laid out a requirement for all councils with an income over £500,000 to fulfill the duty of Best Value. These duties include the annual publication of a Best Value Performance Plan, carrying out a rolling programme of service reviews and subjection to Best Value audit and inspection. However, the Government has recognised that the duties of Best Value would not be cost effective for smaller parish councils, but it has encouraged such councils to adopt the Spirit of Best Value. In order to secure continuous improvement Best Value requires parish councils to look at their function in terms of the '5 Cs'. These are:-

Challenge - why, how, and by whom a service is being provided

Compare performance with the performance of other parish councils and organisations providing similar services

Consult local people and key partners, including local businesses and voluntary organisations in setting council priorities

Use fair and open **Competition** wherever practicable as a means of securing efficient and effective services.

Collaborate with other authorities and public service providers, particularly in developing, delivering, monitoring and improving services.

Carn Brea Parish Council believe that the principle of the council examining the services that they provide is a sound one, which should provide value for money for the taxpayer. They have therefore published this report reviewing the services that they have provided and hope that the publication of this report will lead to a better understanding of what the Parish Council does and how it spends the ratepayer's money. Carn Brea Village Methodist Church

Past records show that in about 1830 a Primitive Methodist Church was built at Blowinghouse. In 1851 the first Sunday school was formed and used a low building donated by Mr. Moyle at the southern end of Carn Brea Village. The site of this building is now occupied by a modern building constructed from Bath stone and owned by the Frost family, who have been members and Youth Workers.

The present Chapel was built from plans made by captain W. Sweet and others. It was built from donated stone at a total cost of £200. A grand opening was held on Wednesday 25th May 1870 when Rev. E. Shelton was the preacher. A bible was donated by the Rector of St Euny (whose friendly links still exist to this day) and a Baptismal font was given by Padstow Methodists. In 1916, volunteers, after digging out the bank, built a vestry and a boiler house. On Saturday 6th June 1959 the new Sunday School built by Roy Jeffery was opened by Miss. E. Ople. There have been many faithful followers through the years.

There have been concert parties and choirs through the years - entertaining here and away - adults and children with solo artists and musicians. For a time the Carn Brea Youth Band was formed with Mr. G. Woods and practised in the Chapel - they gave many enjoyable concerts for us and in various other premises throughout the district.

As we entered the new millennium it was realised that the building was in serious need of attention, amongst many other problems the floor was rotting and the pulpit in a state of collapse. We saw that the building could be further used in

the community as a multipurpose building and decided to embark on a £90,000 refurbishment project, and extensive fundraising activities and appeals were organised. The team for this work comprised Mrs. V. Jenkin (Property secretary), Messrs Keith and Peter Jenkin, Mrs Janet Poole, Mr. Doug Sprague together with various other assistants from the village.

The work was carried out under the direction of Mr. Stephen Tucker of SMT Associates. Refurbishment involved the following works:- Alterations to the access, new porch doors and windows, and the provision of a level floor throughout to enable disabled access. Some pews were removed and replaced with chairs, whilst others were made moveable together with the pulpit, font, and communion table to enable the building to be used as a flexible multi-use facility. The Sunday School area was completely refurbished and upgraded. This work consisted of a new kitchen, the provision of a general purpose area, demolition of existing toilets, and installation of new toilets. Upgrading services included a new gas supply, boiler, radiators, fan convectors, new lighting, emergency lighting, alarm and fire detection system.

Much of the work was carried out by voluntary labour. Services continued, despite at times, the interior of the building being in a state of considerable disarray with piles of rubble as walls were being picked out, and areas of the floor being bare earth as relaying took place.



A grand opening was made in May 2004 carried out by our local MP Candy Atherton. For the occasion a Flower Festival was held with many local churches in the district providing special displays for the occasion.

God's work continues at Carn Brea Village Methodist Church now in its 140th year with weekly services, and special services at Easter, Christmas and Harvest time. All are very welcome. Pictures are available on web site 'Methodist Churches Redruth'

Heartlands is a £35million scheme part funded by the BIG Lottery Fund and led by Cornwall Council to transform an area where Robinson's Shaft sits in Pool, in to a park, gardens, cafe, community building, events arena, heritage centre and market square. In the next few months on walking past the 19 acre site on Dudnace Lane you will see the transformation starting to happen, which will be completed in autumn 2011.

To mark the countdown to opening, Heartlands held a biodegradable balloon release, with 800 balloons each having a tag with local children's 'Hope for Heartlands' written upon it.
