CARN BREA MONUMENT

Carn Brea Parish Council has reached an agreement with Cornwall Council to gain ownership of Carn Brea Monument. At the Annual Parish Meeting Chairman Cllr. Malcolm Moyle said "We've always aspired to own the monument on the top of Carn Brea. Well, now we have the document for signing. We've got to go through the formalities, but very, very shortly the monument at Carn Brea will be ours. Whenever I go away, on my return, I get to about Mitchell and I see the monument on the top of Carn Brea and I know I'm nearly home".

LIGHTING THE MONUMENT

For four nights in May, 17-20 the Monument on Carn Brea was lit up. It was noticed by many residents and the Fire Brigade and Police were called but it was organised by Carn Brea Parish Council in conjunction with Heartlands Flame Festival and carried out by County Councillor Peter Sheppard. Carn Brea Parish Council would hope to repeat this for special events in the future.



HAVE YOUR SAY

Have Your Say is a new way in which members of the public can provide information about the places where they live and say what is good about those places and what they would like to see improved.

This new initiative is a partnership approach to help communities make a difference in their towns and villages with the help of the statutory agencies such as the Police, Cornwall Council, Town and Parish Councils, Probation service and other relevant services.

The Have Your Say campaign will be focused initially on Redruth, Illogan and Carn Brea parishes. Over the coming

weeks you will begin to see Have Your Say questionnaires turning up in busy locations within your parish. When completed the questionnaires can be posted in the collection box where the questionnaire was collected. In the coming months the questionnaire will also be available online.

Once the survey questionnaires have been collected the information gathered will be collated and actions for all of the partners will be prioritised. From that point on the partners will be responding to the information gathered and dealing with the concerns that have come to light through the information gathered.

The Have Your Say partners will be following up the initial survey with

similar questionnaires in the future, to see if the actions that have been taken have had an effect in the priorities areas.

The Have Your Say campaign will enable all residents in the three parishes to say what is good about where they live and what can be improved.

Look out for the questionnaires in your local shops and community venues.

CARN BREA CORNWALL

November 15th 2011 I was in a queue in Agar Road Petrol Station. Over the counter is a screen showing where local traffic hold-ups are. Suddenly, up came "Carn Brea, stationary traffic between Station Road and Penhallick, Carn Brea. Delay 4 minutes". Carn Brea not Camborne or Redruth or Illogan.

As many of you know I have spent much time over the past years researching local Parish Council history and especially the names of parish war dead for our War memorial. The addresses given for such war dead in the West Briton or Cornishman newspapers over the last 100 years, and for other news stories locally was usually Carn Brea not Camborne or Redruth i.e. Pool, Carn Brea or Illogan Highway, Carn Brea.

Recently there have been important events in our Parish. There was the "topping-up" ceremony at the new extension to Camborne-Redruth Hospital at Barncoose. The organisers invited the mayor of Redruth to do the honours even though the hospital is not in Redruth. There have also been events in the west of the Parish where the mayor of Camborne has done the honours. Carn Brea Parish or its Chairmen have never been invited to these functions. When this is pointed out to the organisers, they claim they don't know of Carn Brea.

At Carn Brea Parish Council Meetings recently experts have come to give talks on the progress of this or that. One expert came with his display boards to tell the Councillors at Carn Brea about all the exciting plans for the local infrastructure; new roads, improved public transport etc. The Parish Council asked him about

any plans to re-open Carn Brea Railway Station as part of this. The expert didn't know Carn Brea had a railway station, where it was, nor about the 20 year campaign to have Carn Brea Station re-opened. He even admitted that he knew of Station Road, Pool but didn't know the road went to Carn Brea Railway Station.

We know that Carn Brea Civil Parish was created from the Southern part of Illogan but history was always referred to our area as Carn Brea. Carn Brea Civil Parish is here to stay. Our parishioners should not lose their identity within it, even if Royal mail think we live in Camborne or Redruth. So my proposal is very simple – Let us all now remove the words Camborne or Redruth from our addresses and replace with Carn Brea, Cornwall followed by the post code. By doing this, in our own small way, advertise widely our parish effectively, collectively, in a large way. This will not affect the smooth running of Royal Mail because they only use the house name or number on properties and the post code for the delivery of letters.

There are now many ambitious persons keen to fill up the fields of Carn Brea and Illogan with thousands of houses. We risk being an Urban sprawl absorbed into Camborne and Redruth – as anonymous as Treswithian or Plain an Gwarry.

So lets use Carn Brea, Cornwall on our letters, using the relevant post codes – delete Camborne or Redruth. Postal deliveries will be unaffected.

Best of all, this campaign will not cost any money.

LISTED BUILDINGS

Carn Brea Parish Council has been actively engaged for many years in trying to get special buildings in the parish listed and therefore protected. An example of the importance of this work was shown by the recent sale at auction of the former stables behind Trevenson Church. Fortunately the Parish Council's application to have them listed was successful in 2008 and so a piece of the parish history will be preserved.

The Parish Council has recently been notified of the successful application for listing of the hull at Loscombe Farm and has several other applications pending.

All applications to English Heritage now have to be made online and Cllr. John Rowe has been inputting all the data for the latest tranche of applications.

Cornwall Councillor's Report

The opening of Heartlands has marked a turning point for Carn Brea parish and created much comment across a wide area of Cornwall, the vast majority very positive.

I have been working with other councillors (Cllrs Peter Shepherd, Dave Biggs and Joyce Duffin) and Heartlands on the 'Flame Festival' planned for Saturday 19 May – it is obvious that the Olympic organising committee got things very wrong when they decided not to carry the flame through this area but at least locally we will all have a day to remember at Heartlands. LOCOG has not been very helpful towards the 'Flame Festival' but Cornwall Council has donated substantial funding. Support from Carn Brea Council is appreciated.

The changeover to Cory for Cornwall's waste collections has not gone as badly here as in some areas (touch wood).

Camborne Town Council has withdrawn its objection to the East West Link Road, which will enable housing and regeneration to progress around Chapel Road.

Cornwall Council is market testing the sale of Carn Brea Leisure Centre site in order to gauge interest and whether the amount that could be raised would enable the building of an improved facility nearby.

Works around the Energy Park and Station Road have affected many drivers in Carn Brea. They are nearing completion and should improve road safety and access for pedestrians and cyclists.
