## Devolution King George V Playing Field, Four Lanes and Agar Road Playing Field, Pool

Carn Brea Parish Council (CBPC) decided at its meeting on Thursday 16<sup>th</sup> June 2022 not to accept the devolution of the two parks known as King George V Playing Field in Four Lanes and the Agar Road Playing Field in Pool from Cornwall Council (CC).

The decision was based on the Council's view that the current condition of the two parks required significant expenditure by CBPC to rectify outstanding maintenance and facilities shortcomings. The need to correct a clear lack of investment and maintenance by CC over several years would place an unacceptable and massive financial burden on the residents of Carn Brea Parish through the Parish Precept.

Discussions and negotiations with CC led to an offer of financial support from CC. The view of CBPC was that the offer was completely insufficient to allow CBPC to accept ownership of the parks and to implement all the necessary remedial work and ongoing maintenance.

Nevertheless CBPC wish to thank CC for their devolution offer.

Finally, it is important to recognise that these two parks will continue to exist and be available for use by the public.

## **Tree Planting and Allotments**

The Council is interested to hear from people who can suggest suitable land within the Parish where we could investigate the possibility of planting trees to support our climate change objectives, or suitable land for the creation of allotments.

Thank you to those who told us of land for allotments following the Summer Newsletter. Each suggestion has been looked into, but regrettably we are still without a suitable site. We shall keep looking!

#### **Queens Jubilee Big Lunch**



On Sunday 5<sup>th</sup> June the Council held a Big Lunch Event in Treloweth Open Space, next to the Parish Offices. St Stythians Band entertained us all with their immaculate musical skills, whilst the Brownies and the Rainbows set up a variety of games for everyone to try. During the Event our special Jubilee tree, the Darley Oak sapling, was dedicated. It was grown from an acorn from the Darley Oak, the oldest tree in Cornwall believed to be at least 1000 years old, which still grows near Darley Ford on the edge of Bodmin Moor. Picnics were the order of the day, with pasties, sausage rolls and hot and cold drinks. Grateful thanks to all who attended, especially to our staff who organised and arranged so much!





## **Highway Code Changes**

In January 2022 a number of important changes were made to the Highway Code. Remember, the Code applies to all road users, walkers, cyclists, horse-riders and motorists.

- When people are crossing or waiting to cross at a junction, other traffic should give way
- Where routes and spaces are shared by walkers, cyclists and horse riders everyone should respect the safety of others, by not passing too closely or at speed, by slowing down, remembering that a walker may be deaf, or partially sighted, and by not passing a horse on the horse's left.
- Cyclists in groups should be considerate of the needs of other road users, they can ride 2 abreast, but should be aware of people driving behind and allow them to overtake when it's safe to do so.
- When overtaking, motorists should leave at least 1.5 metres (5 feet) when passing cyclists, 2 metres (6.5 feet) when passing a horse and rider, and the same distance when passing walkers in the road.
- When a cyclist is going straight ahead at a junction, they have priority over traffic waiting to turn into or out of a side road, unless a road sign indicates otherwise.
- Drivers and passengers in vehicles who are about to open their door should use the hand furthest from the door. This should make them turn their head to check if anyone is approaching them from behind, either in the road or on the pavement.
