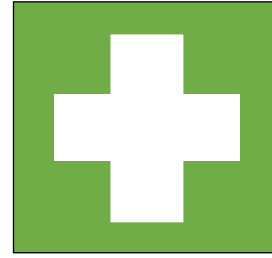

Defibrillator Installation:

A big thank you to the Sportsmans Arms in Pencoys and the Countryman Inn at Piece for agreeing that the Council can install emergency defibrillators on the outside of their pubs as part of our ongoing project to provide defibrillator units in the parish.

We are working again with our partners Duchy Defibrillators and hope these will be installed early in September.



Radar Speed Signs – the latest

Following the decision by Carn Brea Parish Council to purchase a mobile Radar Speed Sign we have recently taken delivery of the new equipment.

Portreath Parish Council gave us the benefit of their experience and we are grateful to them.

Using feedback from you we have worked with the local Highways Manager of Cornwall Council to agree possible locations for the sign, the purpose of which is to remind us of the legal speed limit, to ensure better compliance and higher road safety. The sign will be relocated at regular intervals.

Detailed assessments are now being undertaken at sites in Four Lanes, Pencoys, Piece, Carnkie, Pool, and Broad Lane.



Intention to remove Hosepipe Ban in Cornwall and North Devon:-

South West Water have confirmed that they are on track to lift the hosepipe restrictions in Cornwall and Upper Tamar on 25th September 2023.

Until the ban is lifted, please be mindful that anyone found completing any of the below activities with a hosepipe, without permission of South West Water, may be fined up to £1,000.00:-

- Watering a garden (this includes allotments).
- Cleaning a private motor-vehicle (this includes taxis).
- Watering plants on domestic or other non-commercial premises.
- Cleaning a private leisure boat.
- Filling or maintaining a domestic swimming pool or paddling pool (some exceptions below).
- Drawing water, using a hosepipe, for domestic recreational use (this includes hot tubs).
- Filling or maintaining a domestic pond (unless it has fish in it).
- Filling or maintaining an ornamental fountain (unless its purpose is to keep fish healthy).
- Cleaning walls, or windows, of domestic premises.
- Cleaning of paths or patios.
- Cleaning other artificial outdoor surfaces.

NB. You can still carry out the above activities with mains water as long as you use a bucket or watering can.
