

Carn Brea Parish Neighbourhood Development Plan

On 1st August 2024 the result of a Public Referendum approved the Carn Brea Parish Neighbourhood Development Plan (NDP) with 88% of the votes cast in favour of the Plan. Thank you to everyone who took part in the vote. The NDP has taken several years of incredibly hard work to create. The NDP Working Group, made up of local residents and Carn Brea Parish

Councillors, were guided through a minefield of red

tape by planning consultant Steve Besford-Foster.

The process of building the plan has involved a great deal of public consultation, including Open Sessions held in Four Lanes, Carnkie, Carn Brea Village and in Pool, with leaflet drops by Royal Mail on several occasions and hundreds of letters to community groups, local businesses, churches, schools, and public utilities.

Thank you to every single one of you who attended an Open Session or sent us your thoughts or views. All of these contributions have helped to shape the Plan and we really appreciate your submissions.

Our Plan now gives us, as the Parish Council, a bigger say in how new building development, or conversions of old stock, should happen in Carn Brea Parish. We can use the Policies set out in the Plan to inform decisions on planning applications within the Parish.

The Plan sets out our approach to housing, business and jobs, the natural environment and our landscape, the built environment and our heritage, access and connectivity, open green spaces and recreation, community facilities and finally climate change. You can see the Plan on our website and there is a paper copy available to read in our offices. If you have a question about the Plan please feel free to email or call us.

Perhaps the biggest round of applause should go to the NDP Working Group itself who beavered away for the last three years, week after week, slowly making progress in building the Plan, seeing it pass several clinical inspections and then receive approval at the Public Referendum.

The Working Group were led by Chairman Cllr. Malcolm Moyle, Vice Chairman Mr Peter Lee, Mr Warwick Addison, Cllrs Elly Glanville, Chris Jordan and Bob Drew, supported by our Clerk, Andrew Moyle-Browning and Assistant Clerk, Sarah-Jane Noakes. Our Consultant Steve Besford-Foster kept us on the straight and narrow.

The whole point of all of this is so that we can, and will, improve the Planning process in Carn Brea Parish which must be a good deal for the people of the Parish.

Mobile Speed Indicator Sign

The Speed Indicator Sign has been in place now for 8 months and you may have seen it on your travels across the Parish.

Since the last newsletter, it has been located in Piece – Loscombe Road, Pool – Church Road, Moorfield Road and Four Lanes – Loscombe Road. The speed limits within these areas are 20mph or 30mph.

The maximum speeds recorded at these locations range from 42mph to 85mph.

All the data collected (which measures both incoming and outgoing vehicle speeds) is shared with Cornwall Council Highways and Devon and Cornwall Police Roads Policing Unit. The Council have asked to be updated on any action that will be taken with regards the excessive speeds that have been captured within the data.

Four Lanes B3297 (Chapel Row)	25/11/24 - 06/01/25
Piece	06/01/25 - 03/02/25
Pool (Church Road)	03/02/25 - 03/03/25
Four Lanes (Loscombe Road)	03/03/25 - 31/03/25
Pool (Moorfield Road)	31/03/25 - 28/04/25

The sign is relocated every 4 weeks in line with the guidance provided that suggests that if the unit is in one place for extended periods, this can reduce the impact.
