Dial 159



159 is a safe and secure way to contact your bank, helping to protect you from financial fraud. The service is supported by major UK banks and telecommunications companies.

If you receive a suspicious call or message, involving any type of financial transaction, including those claiming to be from your bank, your telecoms provider, HMRC, the police, STOP.

Call 159, to check the authenticity of the call, ideally call from a different phone to ensure the scammer can't intercept or redirect your call. If you only have one phone available to use, wait a short while, then phone a friend who's voice you will recognise. This ensures that your phone line is now clear. Then call 159.



Under the Elections Act 2022 all existing postal vote arrangements will now expire after 3 years. Anyone who had a postal vote in place before the new rules came into effect will continue to receive one until 31st January 2026. After that date residents must reapply if they wish to continue voting by post. Cornwall Council Electoral Services will be contacting residents by email or post, starting in July 2025. Please let your friends and neighbours know about this. This will not apply to some postal voters who have only recently applied. Cornwall Council will only contact those who need to take action. If an election comes along after next January and you haven't re-applied for your postal vote you will still have the right to vote by attending your designated polling station, but not by using a postal vote.
