Neighbourhood Plan

We are currently analysing the replies you have provided us in response to our recent questionnaire about our Neighbourhood Plan. We will then be able to better focus on the issues you have highlighted as being of most value, of most concern, and those facilities you would like to see developed within the Parish. Thank you to all of you who replied – it is much appreciated. We will bring you the findings in the next edition.

Carn Brea Railway Station

Many of you will be aware that a railway station, Carn Brea Halt, once stood on the main railway line at the southern end of Station Road, Pool. The Council is committed to seeking the re-instatement of this facility. The justification becomes increasingly more relevant the

greater the amount of residential and commercial development in the wider Pool area. We have recently approached Great Western and Railtrack and asked them to consider (again) the strong commercial and environmental case in re-opening Carn Brea station.

Boundary Review

You will be aware of the Boundary Commission's decision to reduce the number of Cornwall Councillors from 123 to 87. If you wish to submit your views on the proposed new Divisions, (search on 'electoral review' on Cornwall Council's website to see them) your thoughts must be sent to the Local Boundary Commission (not Cornwall Council) by 19th February 2018.

GREEN INFRASTRUCTURE FOR GROWTH

Making space for nature

Cornwall Council has secured funding for a major investment in local urban green spaces across a number of Cornish towns as part of the Green Infrastructure for Growth (GI4G) project. £3.5 million will be spent over the next 3 years on public recreational areas, roadside verges and old churchyards to make them better places for people and for wildlife. The environmental funding will create nature-rich habitat



across an area equivalent to 35 rugby pitches. Seven Cornish towns have been identified to receive investment through GI4G, including four projects in Carn Brea Parish. The concept design for Moorfield Road verges is not yet available. The GI4G team have already created concept designs and begun a series of consultation events for some of the seven towns.

Merlin MS Centre's Day Respite Service

The Merlin MS Centre, located on the A390 between St Austell and Truro, has provided a Day Respite Service since 2014. However, a recent and very generous donation by local property developer, Mr Denis Angille, has allowed the service to be extended to three days a week.

The service which aims to prevent isolation and loneliness for people in Cornwall living with long-term neurological conditions will now be run on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays and will provide activities, workshops, social interaction and access to health and wellbeing as well as exercise therapy.

The Day Respite Service is run by a team of experienced staff. Assessments are carried out prior to new service users starting to ensure all personal needs are met.

Ali Lochrie, Respite Manager, said: "We are delighted to be able to offer this service on an additional day. Carers, who are often a family member or a spouse, will have the chance to get a break from their caring duties knowing their loved one is in a stimulating and safe environment."

John was diagnosed with Parkinson's 12 years ago. His wife Sue has been John's primary Carer for those 12 years. Using Merlin MS Centre's Day Respite Service has meant that for the first time Sue has had time for herself.

"I can totally relax now and know

that I don't have to worry about John. Whilst John is in respite it allows me to do the things which I can't normally do when he is with me" says Sue

The Centre also offers a transport service which means those who live in rural isolated areas and can't access public transport can still use the facilities available at the Centre.

The Merlin MS Centre's charitable aim is to provide subsidised therapy for people who are affected by Multiple Sclerosis (MS), however, anyone living with a neurological condition who feels they can benefit from the therapies and support offered is welcome.

The purpose-built facilities provide; clinical therapies such as physiotherapy, occupational therapy, sensory integration, exercise classes and podiatry, a range of health and wellbeing therapies as well as respite, counselling and outreach services. The Centre also offers a transport service covering most of the County.
