Brother of John Henry, William, Frederick, Samuel, Albert, Sidney, Louise and Richard James of 20 Killiersfield, Pool, Carn Brea, Cornwall. Plus two girls that died of measles.

Of the brothers, Albert, Sidney and Richard also enlisted and survived but Stanley was killed December 1915. Frederick was a serving seaman at the outbreak of war, his ship was sent to New Guinea to take off British Christian Missionaries. Whilst ashore he caught a tropical disease, died and was buried at sea 1917.

Uncle of Samuel John James who was killed March 1918.

Father and brothers all tin miners.
