25/04/APM/05 To present the Clarence Coombe Award.

The Chairman informed the meeting that the Clarence Coombe Memorial Award is in memory of the late Clarence Coombe, a well-respected Councillor who served Carn Brea Parish for many years. The award is presented to a nominee, who has served in Carn Brea Parish and who has given lifelong service, performed an heroic deed, or attained individual achievement through work, study, conquest of illness or disability.

For exemplary long service to our Community, we are awarding Tom French the Clarence Coombe Award.

Tom served with distinction for Queen and Country in the Parachute Brigade and on retirement took office within the Parachute Regimental Association for Cornwall. Over the years Tom has acted as Parade Marshall for our Remembrance Day Parade and Service. Always immaculately smart in his Parachute Regimental Association blazer, beret and pace stick, he exudes the calm but confident exterior that allows him to control and lead those 'on parade'. In private, when involved in the planning and organisation of Commemoration and Memorial events, Tom listens, advises and guides event organisers. His expertise and wisdom help to ensure the appropriate level of respect for the occasion. At Carn Brea's War Memorial Tom gives his words of command to Royal Naval and RAF personnel, cadets, veterans from the three services, Police Officers, Standard Bearers from the Royal British Legion, Brownies and Rainbows. Each year in September, Tom takes charge of the Battle of Britain Memorial Service at the Commonwealth War Graves Commission site in Illogan Church Yard. Immediately afterwards Tom will carry out the same duties at RAF Portreath, commemorating RAF and Parachute Regiment men of the Glider Brigade.

Mrs. P. Coombe presented the Clarence Coombe Award to Tom French for services to Carn Brea Parish.

Tom French gave thanks to everyone.

25/04/APM/06 To present the Marise Levenson Award.

The Chairman informed the meeting that the Marise Levenson Memorial Award is in memory of the late Marise Levenson and recognises the contribution of young people in the community. The award is presented to a young person under the age of 18 who has served in Carn Brea Parish and who has contributed to the local community through charitable acts, altruistic caring acts or unrecognised achievements etc.

The Chairman presented the Marise Levenson Award to Poppy Webber a member of the 1st Pool Brownies.



Poppy has completed 3 years in the Brownies and in her role as a Sixer is always the first to support other people, both children and adults. Despite her young age, she can make adaptations for others so that everyone can participate in an activity and she encourages everyone, regardless of their ability or level of confidence. Within the community Poppy has undertaken litter picks, completed her Charities interest badge raising money and awareness for the Ronald McDonald houses, and increased awareness about recycling. She takes part in the local Pantomime and is a fantastic role model for her little sister and is a friend to everyone. Poppy does all of this with a smile on her face and a skip in her step. Her kindness and thoughtful behaviour have had a positive impact on our Community.

Poppy thanked the Council for the award.

25/04/APM/07 To present the Carn Brea Parish Council Local Achievement Awards.

The Chairman informed the meeting that the Local Achievement Award is to recognise the contribution by an individual where they have gone above and beyond for an individual or group in their local community.

This year the Council are awarding two Local Achievement Awards:

The Chairman presented a Local Achievement Award to Kathryn Marsh in recognition of her outstanding contribution to the Community through her instrumental work in establishing the Heartlands Parkrun.

Thanks to Kathryn's dedication and hard work it has become a thriving weekly event which is free to take part in, attracting typically around 200 people each Saturday. Supported by a group of about 30 volunteers, the Heartlands Parkrun attracts not only local runners of all ages, but visitors from across the UK and beyond, bringing people into the Parish and strengthening community connections. Beyond the event itself Kathryn puts in an incredible amount of time and effort to ensure things run smoothly, helping to maintain the site, keeping it safe and tidy, especially important since Heartlands closed as a visitor attraction.

Kathryn expressed a big thank you to the Community for their involvement in being instrumental in keeping the Parkrun going after the closure of Heartlands, special thanks to the Duke of Edinburgh volunteers and thanked the Council for the award.

The Chairman presented a Local Achievement Award to Louise Hollick for her work in setting up and maintaining a community book share called the Little Free Library for her community in and near Agar Crescent, Pool.

Louise obtains and provides books to stock the book cabinet near her home and although the Free Library was set up during the Covid period, the service still exists and is enjoyed by everyone in her locality. Louise's contribution is entirely voluntary and is a shining example of how individuals can make a difference to their neighbourhoods.

Louise expressed how nice it had been to watch the book share grow with the help of her neighbours and gave thanks for the award.

Gazelles Gymnastics Club

Guild of Friends (Camborne Redruth Community Hospital)

A call for volunteers was expressed to continue the good work of the Guild of Friends to support the hospital and staff. Thanks were expressed to Carn Brea Parish Council for the continued support.

Carn Brea Women's Institute

Vicki Watkins gave a brief summary of the written report and expressed that a successful year had been had thanks to the support of all members and the Community. Carn Brea Women's Institute meet on the second Tuesday of each month at 7pm at the Trevenson Church Community Hall.

1st Pool Brownies

Hannah Tame (Brown Owl) gave a verbal report.

Children do not all fit into one stereotypical box and we really shouldn't be trying to force them to, we need to value the importance of play on children's mental health and wellbeing. At 1st Pool Brownies we attempt to give the girls as many different experiences and opportunities as possible, we allow them to play, create and have fun but with purpose. With over 500 volunteers in Girlguiding Cornwall alone the number of girls accessing this type of provision is huge! That is what Guiding is, getting to know your girls and understanding their personal challenges and giving them the opportunity to overcome them in a fun and safe way with their friends around to cheer them on! The activities the girls complete with us build resilience, self-confidence and teach life skills that they take with them into adulthood and are of course transferable to their future careers.

During the last 12 months 1st Pool Brownies have completed a camp in a day, a one-night sleepover, a two-night camp in tents, a two-night transition camp for the older girls to the local Guide unit, completed 260 badges, enrolled 9 new girls, had 5 girls transition to Guides, one of which is returning as a Pack Leader next term. The girls have covered topics such as robotics, financial literacy and Cornish heritage. Made remembrance stones for the Remembrance Service, looked at firework safety, held their annual Christmas Fayre and attended the Council's Carol Concert and most recently made bug boxes with Anita for Moorfield Open Space.

Hannah expressed that this is a team effort and gave thanks to the Leaders, Parents, the Community and Carn Brea Parish Council for being part of our team.



Cornwall Butterfly Conservation

Susan Allen gave a verbal report.

An update on butterflies and biodiversity of the Parish was provided, more sites are being assessed for more connection for wildlife and more conservation work including the creation of wildlife habitats. The Cornwall Butterfly Conservation are looking for an Engagement Officer and all the information about projects and field trips around the County and volunteering opportunities can be found on our Website and Social Media. Susan expressed thanks to the Cornwall Mining Villages Regeneration group.

Duchy Defibrillators

Alan Odgers gave a verbal report.

There are 284 green Duchy Defibrillator cabinets containing public defibrillators across Cornwall, these have been deployed 454 times during 2024 with 5 lives saved and so far in 2025 103 times with 2 lives saved. Two new cabinets, one at Taylors Tyres and one at Grapevine Community Church have been added within the Parish, with another being taken over at the Premier Store, Pool. With the funding from the Cornish charity Front Line Emergency Equipment Trust (FLEET) 270 of the cabinets have had the addition of bleed kits added. Alan expressed a big thank you to Carn Brea Parish Council for their continued support.

Camborne Redruth Community Hospital

Sue Greenwood gave a verbal report.

Sue expressed many thanks to the Community for their continued support during the hospital and car park improvements, which include wards improvements, same day Emergency Care unit, Urgent Treatment Centre (UTC) unit and the new stroke unit. It is hoped that a Summer fete will be held this year.

The Chairman gave thanks and appreciation to Camborne Redruth Community Hospital and all the staff.
